#### Save the Date!

As you may know, we have a very important anniversary coming up next year - the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the World's first Green Ban which was put in place at Kelly's Bush in June 1971.

This amazing 'first' was the result of a dogged campaign by local women who were determined to save the bush for their children and protect it from development. With the help of the Unions, they finally prevailed and, to celebrate this momentous occasion, we will be having an event at Weil Park on **Sunday 29 August 2021** from 10am to 2pm.

We will be unveiling a new memorial picnic table and are delighted that our main speaker for the event will be Meredith Burgmann, famous for her comprehensive book on the Green Bans.

There will also be a community market and native plant stalls plus an opportunity to

enjoy a Devonshire Tea as an 'homage' to Jack Mundey's 'morning tea with the matrons'!

We expect that the walking path through the Bush will be upgraded in time for a guided walk on the day.

Many of the lovely images shown here are taken from a book on the *Flora of Kelly's Bush* compiled by our very own Liz Hinton, using photographs taken in the bush in 1997 by Peta Hinton. This commemorative booklet, will be available on the day and will contain a full species list of plants unique to Kelly's Bush (with fabulous images) and a potted history of the saving of Kelly's Bush for the nation. We hope it will be a very special keepsake to coincide with the anniversary.

This will be a great day to visit the Bush so save the date and make sure you are there to join in the celebration!
