How are you enjoying the cold? We're all finding it a bit chilly in the mornings and are now starting at 8.30am to give us a little more time under the duvet!



## 50<sup>TH</sup> Anniversary Celebration

Sunday 29 August 10am-12pm

We hope you've already saved the date to come and celebrate the world's first Green Ban – **which happened right here at Kelly's Bush in June 1971.**

This amazing 'first' was the result of a dogged campaign by local women who were determined to save the bush for their children and protect it from development. With the help of the unions, they finally prevailed. After the success at Kelly's Bush, over 100 heritage buildings stand in Sydney today because of Green Bans that the unions imposed on any building the National Trust valued.

To mark this historic year, we're having a celebration at Weil Park on Sunday 29 August from 10am to 12pm.

The program will include two excellent speakers. Meredith Burgmann, author of Green Bans, Red Union, The Saving of a City who spoke at Jack Munday's State Memorial, and then we'll hear from local celebrity Tim Ross, comedian, author and TV presenter whose 'Summer Night Walks' video shared his connection to the history and stories of Kelly's Bush [www.youtube.com/watch?v=8c7-fBVG\\_AM&t=90s](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8c7-fBVG_AM&t=90s)

We're delighted that the last of our band of Battlers, Dr Joan Croll, will be on hand to unveil a memorial table at the Weil Park entrance for use by our local community and the many visitors who walk through Kelly's Bush.

There will be two free guided walks through on the day at 11.00 and 11.30, as well as community stalls and native plants for sale, plus a sausage sizzle and an opportunity to enjoy a Devonshire Tea, as a tribute to Jack Munday's fond recollections of 'morning tea with the matrons'.
